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## ALBERTA PUBLISHER LAUNCHES NEW PODCAST FIRST EPISODE NOW AVAILABLE ONLINE

Edmonton's Spotted Cow Press has launched the first in a series of podcasts featuring interviews with its authors. The podcasts are available for free download from <a href="http://spottedcow.typepad.com/spotted\_cow\_podcasts/">http://spottedcow.typepad.com/spotted\_cow\_podcasts/</a> and the iTunes music store.

The inaugural podcast features well-known radio and television host Bob Chelmick interviewing Dr. Susan Minsos, author of *Weird Tit-for-Tat: the Game of Our Lives*. This is the first in a series of podcasts from Spotted Cow Press. Subsequent shows will discuss Dr. Jerome Martin's *Cappuccino U*, a freely-distributed e-book on the future of learning, and *Survival Secrets*, Brian Emdin's essential, myth-dispelling handbook to wilderness survival.

Minsos's book is a provocative look at how it is that human beings can be both highly selfish and competitive creatures and yet still manage to find a way to work together in a way that often benefits everyone, creating a culture that serves the needs of individual and group alike.

In the podcast, Minsos and Chelmick discuss her argument that the traditional logic of what game theorists describe as "Tit-for-Tat," a model based around the choice of either cooperating or not, is in fact too simple to describe the interaction between individuals within a larger culture.

The game we really play, she proposes, is actually a kind of "Weird Tit-for-tat" in which players of the game of life choose either to dominate, comply or defect, regardless of whether these actions are carried out cooperatively, or through coercion.
